1. 2019 Trainings

- Rachelle and Heather attended two different trainings
- b. Key takeaways:

 - ii. We need to make sure that our focus remains on the plans Digital Citizenship, School Safety, TSSP and the data
 - iii. Fundraising is not a requirement or a function of Community Councils, although we have been involved in that for many years
 - iv. We need to make sure that fundraising is not our focus as a Community Council, although we can support those efforts

2. STEAMraiser

- a. Heather has reviewed the data and rated the prizes by success; we can better focus our efforts in the future on prizes that generated the most interest
- b. The thermometer created a lot of buzz among the students
- Heather polled a lot of parents to determine what aspects of the fundraiser were most effective –
 different things were incentives for different people
- d. The class incentives created a bit of taunting between students/classes something to consider for future years
- e. There was a lot of lost classroom time teachers are grateful for the fundraising effort and the success, but it may not be sustainable

3. Fundraising

- a. Proposal from parents to combine Community Council and PTA fundraising
- b. One time ask a year that would fund PTA needs, school needs, and classroom needs
- c. We would need to ensure transparency in how the money is spent
- d. In order to allocate funds between different needs, we would create a formula to divvy the money and set priorities if money did not cover all the identified needs

- f. All of our Community Council fundraising in the past has had a real purpose with a real need driving the effort
