Introductions

- Internet safety night ensure digital safety is taught through the school community
 - Previous years sent out a flier one year, did a big event night another; it can be big or small but it is the council's responsibility
- Help implement the school improvement plan
- Advisory role for the school
- Community Council is focused on test schools and academics; PTA is focused on extracurricular and student life these are not mutually exclusive and we will work together!

Assignment of Community Council Roles

- Chair Julianne Zollinger was chair last year
 - Responsibilities include: proposing meeting agenda and servicing as the main point of contact with TJ. Chair leads the council meetings they are in charge of this process
 - 2022-2023 chair Julianne Zollinger Rachel Helgeson nominates, Emily Jensen seconds, unanimously confirmed by the council
- Vice Chair
 - Responsibilities: serves if the Chair is absent and takes minutes to be posted to the public as these are public meetings
 - 2022-2023 Vice Chair Matt Trump Rachel Helgeson nominates, Julianne seconds, unanimously confirmed by the council
- PTA Liaison The hope is that PTA and Community Council will work together more during this school year liaison will facilitate.
 - Responsibilities: Attend PTA meetings on the 2nd wed of every month, to ensure we're working together and we're on the same track. Additionally, serve as the CC representative for the joint PTA/CC fundraiser this year.
 - 2022-2023 Robin Brown Julianne Zollinger, as Chair, assigned the role, Robin accepted
- Book Review Groups Principal Naylor
 - District Book Review District has asked community members to serve as a review committee for books when they are challenged at the district level

- The plan is for a maximum of 4 book reviews through the year for the member before rotation
- For a book to be permitted, it must not violate Utah Code 53G-10-103. <u>https://le.utah.gov/xcode/Title53G/Chapter10/53G-10-S103.html</u> Challenged books will be evaluated based on the criteria given.
- The district has streamlined the process to allow challenged books to be reviewed by an objective, diverse, and transparent review committee
- Review committee's will be selected, at random, out of the representatives across the district community councils
 - Julianne has been asked by TJ to be the District book review, Julianne accepted
- School Based Book Review Heather Taylor, School Librarian, is required to obtain approval for proposed book purchases approved by the school committee
 - Largely communication through email to approve a list of books
 - o 2022-2023 Rachel Helgeson has been nominated by Julianne, Rachel accepted

Halloween Costumes Discussion

- The pros and cons of Halloween costumes were discussed at length with arguments made for and against
 - The summary of the conclusion of the council is that costumes have, in the past caused unnecessary stress for teachers and have become problematic
 - Students will still be invited to participate in Halloween parties and are welcome to wear fun socks or shirts etc...
 - Costumes have not always been allowed at Stewart and the council was in favor of Halloween costumes not permitted for this year
